Doors open approximately one hour before performance time.

All concerts will begin promptly at 8:00 p.m.

As a courtesy to the performers and the audience, late arrivals will be seated after the opening number or at the discretion of the management.

Season subscriptions and tickets for individual concerts are sold through the Erie Philharmonic office, 409 G.D. Baldwin Bldg., Erie, Pa. 16501, Ph. (814) 455-1375.

The office is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays, and from 9 a.m. to noon Saturdays. (On concert day only)

Tickets may be purchased in person, by phone, or by mail with a self-addressed stamped envelope.

- **Discounts:** Students receive a 50% discount in sections 6, 7, 8, & 9. Children receive a 50% discount when sitting with parents, except in section 1. Senior Citizens receive \$1.00 discount on single admission tickets. Discounted tickets to be used by Senior Citizens and students only. Group rates are available upon request by calling the office.
- Exchanges: No exchanges will be made from one event to another, or for events that have already taken place. Exchanges will be made for the same event/same date at no charge other than the additional difference in the ticket price.
- Refunds: Sorry, there are no refunds on any tickets. Please check your tickets carefully at the time of your purchase.



#### Eiji Oue, Conductor



With the commencement of the 1990-91 season, Mr. Eiji Oue becomes the 10th Music Director of the Erie Philharmonic Orchestra. Born in Hiroshima, Japan, he studied conducting with Hideo Saito at the Toho School of Music and with Larry Livingston at the New England Conservatory. In 1978, Mr. Oue was invited by the Boston Symphony Orchestra's Music Director Seiji Ozawa to participate in the conducting program at the Tanglewood Music Center. In 1980, he returned to Tanglewood and received the Koussevitzky Memorial Fellowship Prize. In the summer of 1981, he won the Hans Haring First Prize in the conducting competition at the Salzburg Mozarteum. The following year, he made his west coast debut at the Hollywood Bowl with the Los Angeles Philharmonic Institute Orchestra. Mr. Oue has studied under Seiji Ozawa, Sergui Celibidache, Andre Previn, Sir Colin Davis, Kurt Masur, and Leonard Bernstein. It is Maestro Bernstein, in particular, who has had the profoundest influence on his artistic refinement.

He was the Associate Conductor of the Buffalo Philharmonic from 1986 to 1990. In the summer of 1990, he assisted in the creation of the Pacific Music Festival in Sapporo, Japan where he acted as Resident Conductor for the Festival Orchestra and as

Guest Conductor for the London Symphony Orchestra, which he subsequently led on a tour of Japan. Other orchestras which Mr. Oue has worked with include the Santa Cecilia Orchestra in Rome, the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra, the Oakland Symphony Orchestra, the Springfield Symphony Orchestra, the Pro Arte Chamber Orchestra, the Hartford Symphony Orchestra, the Sapporo Symphony Orchestra, and the New Japan Philharmonic Orchestra.

Additionally, Mr. Oue has served as Guest Conductor for a number of renowned music festivals such as the Tanglewood Festival, the Wolftrap Festival, the Greatwoods Festival, and the Midland Festival. He has also toured internationally, and in 1985 conducted the European Community Youth Orchestra in performances dedicated to world peace. This tour included stops in Hiroshima, Athens, Budapest, and Vienna. The summer of 1989 found him once again in Europe during which time he conducted the Santa Cecilia Orchestra of Rome and the Schleswig Holstein Festival Orchestra.

Mr. Oue's long dedication to the training and education of young musicians is evidenced by his active participation with several premier organizations. He was the Music Director of the Greater Boston Youth Symphony Orchestra which he led on several international tours. He has also served as the Music Director of the Brown University Orchestra, as Principal Conductor of the Boston University Tanglewood Institute Young Artists Orchestra, and has appeared as Guest Conductor of the All-Eastern Festival Orchestra, the New England Conservatory Symphony Orchestra, the Repertory Orchestra, the Oberlin Conservatory Orchestra, and several All-State Festival Orchestras.

Mr. Oue has performed with such soloists as Midori, Peter Serkin, Maureen Forrester, Ivan Morovitz, Barbara Hendricks, and Joseph Silverstein. His list of recordings includes Mahler's Symphony #1, Bizet's Carmen, Holst's The Planets, Ravel's Alborada Del Gracioso, and Respighi's Pines of Rome.







#### Vicki Jamison, Lyric-coloratura Soprano



Before moving to Pennsylvania in 1981, **Vicki Jamison**, lyric-coloratura soprano, was an active performer with the Milwaukee Opera Company and Florentine Opera Company in Wisconsin, singing the roles of Susanna in *Le Nozze di Figaro*, and Frasquita in *Carmen*, as well as a number of comprimario roles. She

performed the title role in *Princess Ida*, with the Connecticut Stage Inc., and appeared as a soloist with the Waterbury Symphony and Oratorio Society in Connecticut.

Since joining the part-time music faculty at Allegheny College, Jamison has appeared in the Warren Festival of the Arts, soloed with the Meadville Chorale, the University Circle Chorale and the Cleveland Institute of Music Chamber Orchestra. In the Allegheny Summer Music Festival, Jamison has played the role of Lucy in *The Telephone*, and Madame Goldentrill in *The Impressario*, as well as soloing in Mahler's 4th Symphony and Bach's Cantata 51.

Jamison graduated from the University of Northern Iowa where her major teacher was Charles Matheson. She later studied with Eleanor Lutton Gardner in Chicago and Marga Mueller at Yale. Her present teacher and coach is her husband Ward Jamison. She resides in Meadville, PA.



Jamison sang the recurring theme, "Dona Nobis Pacem" in a sweet, clear voice that at times verged on the ethereal. A rather small voice, its clarity and good diction enhanced its carrying power.

Choi's baritone has broad range, power, excellent diction and a dark timbre that was especially effective for his solos in this melodic, haunting composition.

Choi made his debut with the New York City Opera last month to excellent reviews as Jake in "La Fanciulla del West" by Puccini. A natural Verdi baritone, one hopes he will take his time before essaying the heavier Verdi roles for which he surely will be courted.

#### Vaughan Williams: Dona Nobis Pacem

One of many vocal compositions by Ralph Vaughan Williams, Dona Nobis Pacem ("Give us peace") was written when the clouds of war were gathering over Europe in the '30's. It is based on texts selected from the Bible, Whitman's portrayal of the brutality of war, and a speech delivered by John Bright before Parliament. This six section cantata for soprano, baritone, and chorus was first performed at Huddersfeld (England) in 1936.

## Mozart: "Deh, vieni alla finestra" from Act 2 Don Giovanni

Don Giovanni is a charmer of women. In one act we see several examples of his seductive power and hear of others. The last is with Zerlina, a peasant girl. She is intrigued with him although she is engaged to be married. As the second act opens, he seeks to take advantage of Zerlina's interest. Disguised as his servant, Leporello, Don Giovanni appears outside the house where Zerlina is a servant and with mandolin in hand sings "I stand beneath your window." The serenade is interrupted with the appearance of her fiance.

#### Wagner: "O du mein holder Abendstern" from Act 3 Tannhäuser

The knight Tannhäuser has been sent on a pilgrimage to Rome to find forgiveness for his sins. While he is away Elizabeth waits for and prays for him at the place where the pilgrims pass Wartburg Castle on their return. She is losing her health in her vigil. The knight, Wolfram, tries to persuade her to return to the castle but fails. In the darkness, he asks the evening star to watch over the grieving Elizabeth.

#### Verdi: "Di provenza il mar" from Act 2 La Traviata

Alfredo has fallen in love with a courtesan, Violetta. They begin living together in her home. His father asks her to end the relationship with his son because the scandal is destroying his sister's chance to marry a man with social standing. Violetta finally agrees to end it, writes a farewell note, and departs for Paris. Alfredo is crushed by the news and his father tries to console him with thoughts of happier times in his native Provence.

#### Verdi: "Eri tu che macchiavi" from Act 4 Un Ballo in Maschera

Renato is convinced his wife has been unfaithful to him. The man with whom she has become involved is the king. Renato threatens her with death but allows her a last opportunity to be with their son to say goodbye. In her absence, standing before a portrait of the king, Renato sings of the treachery of the man whom he admired and served. Now he plans revenge.

#### Rimsky-Korsakov: Scheherazade

In writing this suite for orchestra, Rimsky-Korsakov noted that he was guided by several unconnected episodes from "The Arabian Nights." He wrote "I had in view the creation of an orchestral suite in four movements closely knit by the community of its themes and motives, yet, presenting as it were a kaleidoscope of fairy tale images." The oriental imagery he wished to convey is suggested in the titles of the sections.

Although the composer did not intend to describe events in detail, there are several recurring ideas through the suite. One repreents the Sultan presented at the opening with a predominantly brass fanfare. The other is the Princess expressed in solo violin. This second theme is heard in all four sections of the suite. These two themes unite the suite and are supported by the oriental mood of the music.

Scheherazade was written in 1888 and dedicated to Vladamir Stassoff.

#### Hans Choi, Baritone



Riding the crest of a wave the past few months is Hans Choi. a 31 year old baritone born in Korea. Choi captured two gold medals at the Tchiakovsky Competition held in Moscow in July. Selected gold medalist as the best male singer of this prestigious event, Choi was also given a special gold medal and a complete set of Tchaikovsky works as being the best interpreter of the Russian repertoire in the competition. Prior to that in April, he was the first male winner of the \$10,000 first prize award in the D'Angelo Young Artist Competition held at Mercyhurst College. In October, Choi made his debut with the New York City Opera Co. as Jake Wallace in La Fanciulla del West, and received excellent reviews.

The mellow, honey-colored quality of Choi's voice and exemplary performance in the Tchiakovsky competition moved the legendary Russian mezzo soprano, Irina Arkhipova, to state in a Moscow television interview, "The vocal art of Hans Choi is one of the greatest memories I will treasure in my entire listening experience. This is how a singer should sing — Hans Choi is a revelation to us."

A graduate of Yon Sei University of Music in Seoul, Korea with a degree in music and voice, Choi also holds diplomas from the Osimo Academy, Carlo Bergonzi Academy, the Milan Conservatory, and La Scala Theatre Academy in Milan, Italy. He has studied with well-known vocal coaches Luciano Silvestri, Carlo Bergonzi, Pier Miranda Ferraro, and Enrico Pessina. Choi's \$15,000 silver medallion award received in the 1990 Rosa Ponselle International Vocal Competition made possible his repertoire and dramatic studies under the auspices of the Ponselle Foundation with Igor Chichagov, vocal coach and Roger Brunyate, dramatic coach and noted stage director.

Choi's Italian operatic debuts include the title role in Rigoletto, Renata in Un Ballo in Maschera, Germont, in La Traviata, and Don Carlo in Ernani. His American debuts include the role of the Miller in Luisa Miller, Belcore in L'Elisir d'Amore with the Opera Company of Philadelphia, and the title role in Rigoletto with the San Francisco Opera Company.

Choi has had a notable concert and oratorio career touring and performing with orchestras throughout Asia and Europe. Choi has won several first prizes in his native Korea, including the Government Gold Medal as "Artist of the Year" in 1986. In 1988 he was the winner of the Luciano Pavarotti International Voice Competition.

Future plans for Choi include travelling to Korea this month for an extensive tour, and recording on compact discs. In March Choi will perform with the Savannah Symphony Orchestra, appear at the Savannah Onstage Arts Festival, and return to Erie to appear with the D'Angelo Visiting Artists Series at Tech Memorial Auditorium. Choi will also perform in Chautaugua this summer. Choi is under exclusive management of the Rosa Ponselle Artists' Management, Inc.

Choi resides in New York City with his wife and seven year old son.
