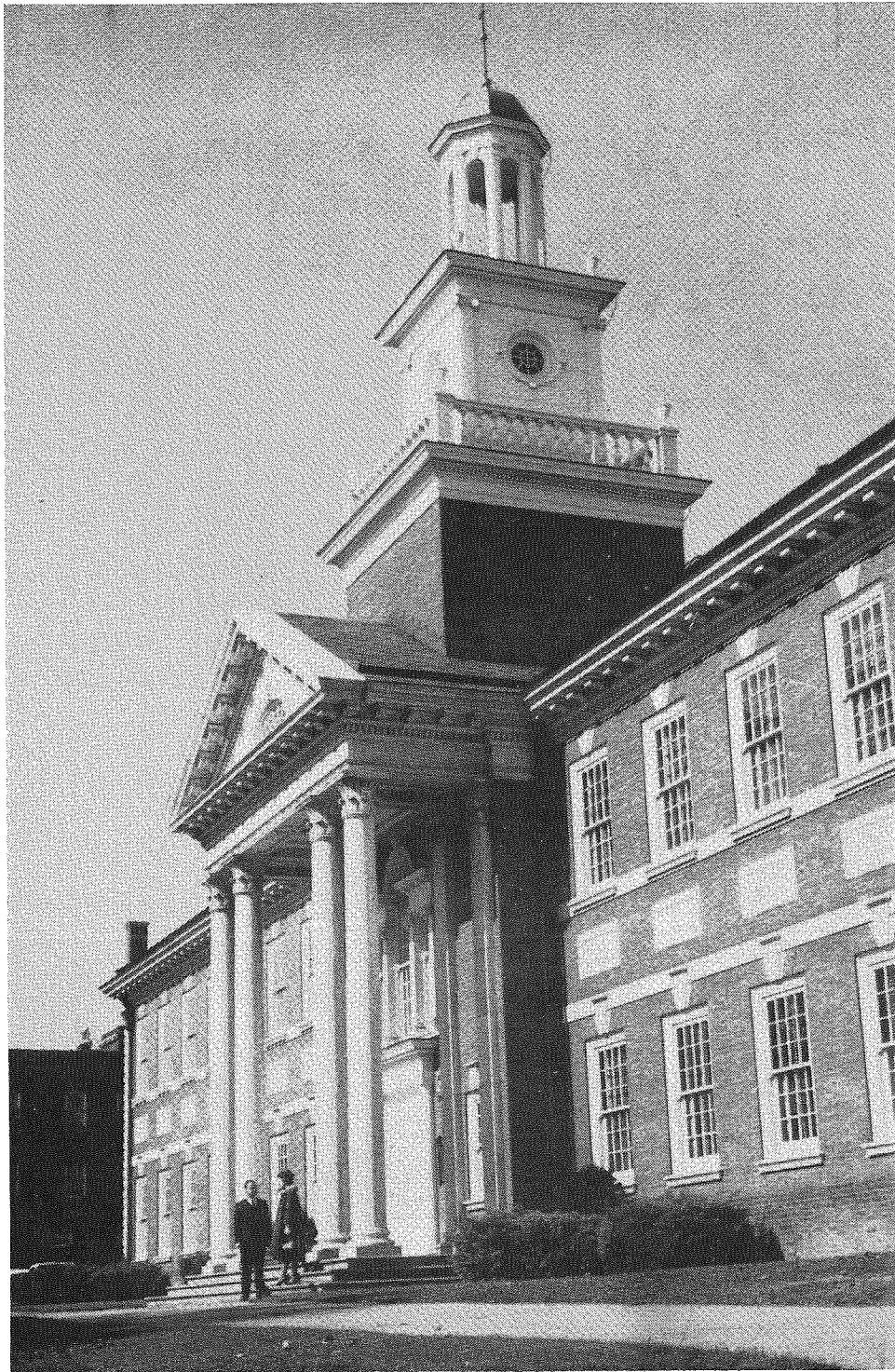

HISTORY OF ORGANIZED MUSICIANS IN ERIE

There are 571 members of the American Federation of Musicians in Erie's Local 17, and among these are the musicians of the Erie Philharmonic Orchestra.

The Erie local of the AFM is among the oldest of the more than 600 locals in the United States and Canada. Local musicians received a charter for Musicians Union No. 5594, American Federation of Labor on November 17, 1891, and later affiliated with the AFM, receiving a charter as Local 17 on November 30, 1896.

Frank A. A. Knoll, of the famous Knoll musical family, is the surviving charter member. A violinist, Knoll lives in the family homestead at 130 West 20th Street, Erie.

Charter members of the Erie local were employed principally in the city's theaters. Theaters and ballrooms provided the bulk of employment for Erie's musicians for the next three decades. With the advent of the soundtrack, veteran musicians lost theater employment. Most entered other lines of work, or continued in music as teachers.

Today not more than a score of the union local's members earn their livelihood solely as performers. Another score combine teaching and performing as their fulltime profession. That so many members of the local maintain such a high degree of proficiency in music is a tribute to their determination to remain close to their first love.

Among the better-known contemporary Erie musicians who have excelled in the serious field are Peter Mennin, young president of New York's respected Juilliard School of Music; his brother, Dr. Louis Mennini, whose Sesquicentennial Symphony was recently premiered by the Erie Philharmonic; pianist Eugene Bossart, a noted accompanist; and Joan Mainzer, former harpist with the Erie orchestra, now with the Minneapolis Symphony.

A number of past and present members of the local union perform with famous dance orchestras, at Radio City Music Hall, and in famous Las Vegas resort hotels. Lt. John Osiecki is conductor of the official U. S. Air Force dance orchestra, "The Airmen of Note."

Local 17 presidents have included W. S. Mueller, 1896-1909; John Manch, 1910-1914; Fred Sapper, 1915-1920; William Brakeman, 1921-1927; Clyde Morgan, 1928-1929; Samuel G. Anderson, 1930; William Brakeman, 1930-1936; Oscar Nutter, 1937-1942; Harry Mueller (the first president's grandson) 1942-1946; and Oscar Nutter, 1947 to the present.

Secretaries included John Durfield, from founding until 1920; Samuel G. Anderson, 1920-1926; Frank Haffey, 1926-1930; and Anderson, again, from 1930 until his retirement last August. A new secretary will be elected in November.
